

# Gas Company Pipeline Project

On August 22, 2011, the Gas Company will embark on a pipeline replacement project impacting Stallion Springs.

History: The pipeline, running through Stallion Springs proper, was originally put in the ground in 1926. It is currently a high pressure pipeline and, as such, presents some inherent risks – both because of its age and the high pressure that runs through the line.

So, for community safety reasons as well as the accommodation of future growth, the pipeline will be replaced and re-configured to be a safer, medium pressure pipeline.

Roads impacted by the replacement include: Jack's Hill, Horsethief, Stallion Springs Drive, San Joaquin, Banducchi and Comanche Point.

Residents can expect to see large equipment including graders, loaders, water trucks as well as welding units and blasting units. The Gas Company will have two individuals called "Fire Watchers" on site at all times who will be watching for spot fires caused by equipment sparks. Fire suppression equipment will also be on site.

The crew will work 4 – ten hour days. The days may increase as the weather gets bad in order to get the job done before winter sets in. The existing pipeline running down Stallion Springs Drive will not be replaced. All roads will remain open however, expect delays due to construction.
